Mon. 2/3 Memorial of St Blaise

St Blaise was a Bishop and a physician. He remembered for his many healings of both people and animals. It is said the animals came to him and knew not to disturb him when he was praying. His association specifically with throats was because of a healing in prison while awaiting execution. Legend has it he was to be drowned but stood on the water taunting nonbelievers to their death. The end result was a far more grizzly death for him.

Wed. 2/5 Memorial of St Agatha

There is a lot of tradition surrounding the life of St Agatha. She was evidently beautiful and had promised herself to Christ. She was arrested as a Christian and legend has it was turned in by a suitor, who was also her judge. Her answer remained unchanged and she was martyred. "Jesus Christ, Lord of all things! You see my heart, you know my desires. Possess all that I am — you alone. I am your sheep; make me worthy to overcome the devil." St Agatha

Thurs. 2/7 Memorial of St Paul Miki and Twenty Five Companions

He was taught by the Jesuits and joined them as a brother. He was known for his preaching and the conversion of many of his Japanese countrymen. Among other things he said during his crucifixion he told those around him to ask Jesus to help them become happy and that he forgave his persecutors. They were all martyred on Nishizaka Hill overlooking Nagasaki

Sat. 2/8 Memorial St Jerome Emiliani

Originally a military commander when he was captured and imprisoned he found God. Realizing that he had been freed from more than prison he took his chains and hung them in a church when he was released. He became a priest and on multiple occasions helped with plagues and famines. He established hospitals and orders but a particular focus of his calling was with orphans. His personal time and savings provided them food, shelter and education.
