Tue. 9/3 Memorial of Saint Gregory

He came from a religious family, some of his aunts were nuns and both his parents were canonized. Their home became a monastery and he wished to live a monastic life there. He ended up first a diplomat on behalf of the Pope and then he was elected to be the pope. Yes, his actions to gathered chants from all over Europe and sort and record them so they could be used in the Liturgy of the Church resulted in them becoming known as Gregorian Chants.

Wed. 9/4 Saint Rose of Viterbo

She was very strict with herself but generous to the poor. She became a Secular Franciscan at 10. Soon she was preaching in the streets and was soon exiled along with her family for supporting the pope in opposition to the emperor. Eventually, the pope won out and the whole family was able to return to their home.

Thurs. 9/5 Saint Theresa of Calcutta

She was the founder of the Missionaries of Charity and a pencil in the hand of God.
