Additional Thoughts from of Saint Teresa of Calcutta:

"Our expanding knowledge does not dim our faith it only shows the size of God's creation. Often we cannot understand. There is a beautiful example in the life of St Augustine who was struggling to understand God, to understand the Trinity, to understand the magnitude of God's creation. His human mind could not grasp it. The he came upon a small boy who was trying to fill water in a hole in the ground. St Augustine asked him what he was doing the boy said: If am trying to fill this hole with water' St Augustine said that it was impossible. Then the child who, in truth, was and angel, said: It is easier to put the ocean into this hole than for you to understand the mystery of God."

Mon. 9/9 Memorial of Saint Peter Claver

He is the patron of African missions and of interracial justice due to his work with slaves in Colombia. He studied in Barcelona and then joined the Jesuits and volunteered for the missions in the Americas. Once in Cartagena, a major port where slaves were sold in South America, he worked daily to minister to hundreds of slaves who arrived each day by bringing them food, medical treatment and the Gospel. He baptized many.

Fri. 9/13 Memorial of Saint John Chrysostom

Not unlike John the Baptist, he was known for simply speaking the truth and living it. He did not spare his supporters or the Imperial Court. As a result, he ultimately died in exile.

Sat. 9/14 Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross

This day is also called the The Triumph of the Cross or by some Holy Cross Day. The Cross of Christ, found in 300's, is the reason we celebrate on this day is because it was first displayed to the public for veneration.
