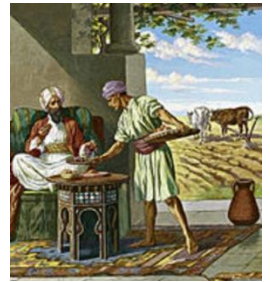

If you register, you can redirect some of your taxes directly to schools on the approved SGO list (like C2, St Barnabas School or Cristo Rey) as a dollar for dollar tax credit. Remember, what you redirect effectively becomes unavailable for other government activities. Go to myalabamataxes.alabama.gov to register. The SGO listing can be found by searching Alabama Revenue Alabama Accountability Act and then scrolling down to Participating Non Public Schools. You can also fund C2 Opportunity Scholarships. Mon.10/7 Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary AKA Memorial of Our Lady of Victory in the past
The old name declared by the Pope because of prayers answered in a naval victory. It is interesting to think of this in the context of St John Bosco’s vision of pope in conference with his bishops guiding the embattled ship of the Church and anchoring to the columns with Mary and the Eucharist. Once there, the enemies dispersed and sank while those who fought beside the popes proceeded in peace.
Wed.10/9 One of the many saints of the day St. Theodoric of Emden was a Martyr of Gorcum
Little is known of him as an individual. He was one of the priests and religious imprisoned, tortured and martyred in the Holland in the late 1500’s by the Calvinists. Why? They would neither renounce the Pope nor deny Christ’s real presence in the Eucharist.
