Tue.10/15 Memorial of Saint Teresa of Jesus

Before the St Teresas: of Lisieux, of the Cross and of Calcutta, was Teresa of Avila AKA of Jesus. She persevered bringing the Carmelites closer to God with her. She was also one of the first women doctors of the church. *"For prayer is nothing else than being on terms of friendship with God."*

Thur.10/17 Memorial of Saint Ignatius of Antioch

He lived in the early 100's and is famous for his letters admonishing the faithful to remain faithful to God, rooted in the teachings of the faith and obedient to the Church. *"It is impossible for a man to be freed from the habit of sin before he hates it, just as it is impossible to receive forgiveness before confessing his trespasses..."*

Fri.10/18 Feast of Saint Luke

Much of his history is unresolved but it is clear that he was a follower of Paul and he is spoken of in multiple books of the bible. He was an educated man and is credited with trying to tie together what was before him into writing. If he wrote the books attributed to him, he wrote a lot of our Bible.

Sat.10/19 Memorial of Saints John de Brébeuf and Isaac Jogues, Priests, and Companions These were the missionary Jesuits that came to what is now Eastern Canada and the North Eastern US in the mid 1500's. They taught many tribes and were all eventually martyred.
